Thirty years ago about this time, I was a junior at Mankato State University. One afternoon as I was having lunch in the cafeteria with a number of international students. We began to talk about our families back home. During our conversation, one of our friends from Iran said, "This is my dream! To be able to bring my mother to America for a visit and then to take her to the mall and tell her to pick up anything her sweet heart desires." He wanted to do all the things for her which he couldn't do when he was back home.

Twenty-eight years have gone by since I saw my friend from Iran. I don't know whether he brought his mother over for a visit or not. But I know that when one is an international student, it is not easy to do these things legally or financially. I too waited a long time for a day when I would be able to help my mother come and see America, the land of plenty. Then, shortly after I became a pastor, my dream came true and she finally came to America. When she arrived here in the state, the first thing I did was take her to a shopping center and said to her, "Mom, get whatever makes you happy." I enjoyed buying her all those things she wanted to have.

Some time later, when she came to Grafton and saw where I lived, she was very surprised to see how I got it good. Especially, after showing her the living room, the kitchen, the two bedrooms and the bathroom with the shower on the first floor, and then when I took her upstairs and showed her the other two bedrooms, the bath room and the shower, she exclaimed, "Is this yours too"? It was hard for her to imagine how one family can have this much. Many things that people often take for granted here, such as washing machines, microwaves, dishwashers, all these things have been too wonderful for her. It was fun to hear what she had to say about all these things and laugh with joy.

Thank you God for making all things possible for my mother to come to America and see the life I share with my congregations. Amen.

Zion Lutheran Church Parish Planning Council Minutes April 19, 2016

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Millie Reierson at 5:30 pm. In attendance: President Millie Reierson, Pastor John Golv, Joel Rude, Penni Nelson, Amber Holtan, Deb Howe, Sharon Jorde, Kristi Numedahl, Tim Numedahl, Connie Hamre, Deb Holtan, Ken Kalsnes, Barbara Overbye, and Pam Cwikla.

Pastor John Golv gave devotions.

A motion was made by Sharon Jorde and seconded by Ken Kalsnes to accept the Council minutes of March 15, 2016 as presented. The motion carried.

Barbara Overbye commented there was a slight increase in income compared to same period last year. She presented a printed treasurer's report for March 2016; discussed and filed for audit.

Barbara reported on the progress made in moving Zion's accounts from Wells Fargo to Northern State Bank. Millie thanked Barbara and Linda Hamrick for the time spent and the work they have done to get the accounts moved.

Silver Creek: Penni Nelson reported the joint service and potluck dinner with Zion will be on Sunday, July 10th. She commented that, while cleaning the church, they found a big television and they don't know who it belongs to. If anyone has information, please let her know.

Properties Board: Board minutes were submitted. Joel Rude reported that grounds committee will begin working on the landscaping updates soon. He reported that donations are being accepted for the flooring in the fellowship hall. Checks can be made out to "Fellowship Hall Flooring." Joel stated that updates are being made to the railing in the balcony. He also commented that they have been assessing the possibility of making the basement bathrooms handicapped accessible. Joel reported that the property at 510 North Knight is available to purchase for \$65,000.

A motion was made by Kristi Numedahl to authorize the Properties Board to make a purchase agreement for the 510 North Knight property using the Saugen fund in the amount of \$65,000. The motion was seconded by Connie Hamre and carried. Joel will check on demolition costs.

Youth and Education Board: Amber Holtan reported that the Seder meal went well. She said the Easter breakfast was also successful. Amber said they are asking for volunteers to make tie-blankets for the seniors. There are 28 seniors.

Volunteers are needed to drive kids to and from camp. Amber stated that the fall confirmation date needs to be set as soon as possible because the meeting with parents is supposed to be next week.



Worship Board: Board meeting minutes were submitted. Sharon Jorde reported on the schedule for summer Wednesday night services "Food, Faith, Family, and Friends" which will begin June 8th.

Pastor Golv commented that representatives from each board will present information about their board and what their responsibilities are at the Wednesday night services. A sign-up sheet was passed around for board chair people to choose their presentation date.

President Millie reminded board chair people to start thinking of board member nominees. Also, a nominating committee should be organized soon.

Public Relations Board: Board minutes submitted. Deb Howe reminded everyone that items for the newsletter are to be in to Darlene Hulteen by April 22nd. She reported that when cleaning the church, they found old computers and televisions. Pastor Golv offered to take them to the Hubbard County Disposal site which disposes of these items at no charge.

Deb commented that the last dates for having pictures taken for the church directory are April 27, 28, and 29. She also requested that a notice be added in the newsletter to remind everyone to notify the church office whenever they change their home phone or cell phone numbers.

Pastors Report: Pastor John submitted his schedule. He stated that the 30-day trial is up for the ultimate worship music solution "Hymnal Plus". He commented that it is very portable and easy to use. Pastor John reported that Zion presented "Hymn Plus" hymnals to local nursing homes so it can be used there. Pastor John commented that Zion and Redeemer are the only churches serving Skylight and the Hi-Rise senior housing.

A motion was made by Sharon Jorde to purchase the "Hymnal Plus" for \$2,700 and the necessary accessories. The motion was seconded by Connie Hamre and carried.



Pastor John presented a printout of "Highlights from the National Congregations Study." He reported that 8 people are enrolled in the "The Once and Future Church" Bible study and 16 people are reading the book.

Millie reported on the upcoming NW MN Synod Assembly which will be held in Moorhead on May 20-21. She asked for volunteers to be delegates to the convention. The keynote speaker will be Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber, from House for all Sinners and Saints, Denver, Colorado.

There was discussion on the hiring of a youth director. Redeemer may be interested in sharing a youth director at a later date, but Trinity's pastor is not interested.

There was also discussion about the security in the church. Some of the Sunday school rooms have been messed up. Penni Nelson reported that Silver Creek was vandalized a week ago. The double-doors were pried open, the water heater was stolen and the floor was flooded.

The next Parish Planning Council meeting will be May 17, 2016.

The meeting concluded with the Lord's Prayer and adjourned at 7:00 p.m.
