

Read 2 Corinthians 12:1-10 Especially verse 9 Epiphany & Lent

As you may know, I have the first part of verse nine on my office wall. Paul is quoting his Lord as saying "My grace is sufficient for you." Even if these words weren't on the wall, they would be with me all the time.

Those few words have guided and encouraged me through many trials.

When I feel wronged in some way, the first part of 2 Corinthians 12:9, brings me back. I commend it to you for all kinds of trials in your life. Why? Because God's grace is in fact sufficient, even more than sufficient, to any challenge we may have to face in life.

This month, please do look also at the second part of verse nine: [my] "power is made perfect in weakness." Some see God's power in the magnificence of creation, in miraculous displays such as the heavenly host, or in supernatural events. Some see God's power as the main theme of the New Testament.

The Cross of Jesus Christ does not look like the power of God. On the contrary, the Cross looks like weakness, defeat, shame, humiliation. The Cross looks like death. But according to the second part of verse nine, displays of weakness are precisely where God's power is most clearly seen.

The president of the seminary began a sermon by saying this: "There is pain in the church." This one comment provoked tears.

The pastor who ordained me (a graduate of LHS in TRF) saw raw idealism in the eyes of new seminary graduates and it brought him to tears.

It is always acceptable to celebrate good fortune, or power or winning. These are things we admire, or copy, or publicize, like coming out on top, or beating the odds. Weakness or losing is to be hidden or covered if possible, so that it won't be seen or heard. According to the second part of verse nine, God's power may in fact be hidden.

You have had times of weakness in your life. There have been painful experiences: funerals, or divorces, or illnesses. They may have been known publicly, or not. Humiliating, or not. Those were the verse-nine times, when God's grace was sufficient for you. These may have been the times when God's power was clear to you. The times of weakness were hard, but not impossible.

A few chapters earlier in 2 Corinthians Paul had some encouraging words for difficult times. He said: (4:8) "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed..." Idealism is important, a strong will is important. Determination and persistence do matter. These things will take us part way. God's power will take us all the way home even in the most challenging time. Why?

Because God's power is made perfect in weakness.


Epiphany is the season of the church year in which we recognize Jesus for who Jesus is. We may call it revelation, or realization, or introduction, but in any case all of us may have the religious experience called an epiphany.

We know who Jesus is. Jesus is the one promised. He heals. He raises the dead. He says things only God can say. He does things only God can do. Then, Luke 9:51. "He [Jesus] set his face to go to Jerusalem."

Lent begins on the fourteenth. On Good Friday in Jerusalem God's power was in fact made perfect in weakness.

Pastor John gave devotions.

The minutes from the December 19, 2017 Council meeting were presented for approval. A motion was made by Glenice Johnson and seconded by Sharon Jorde to accept the minutes as presented. The motion carried.

Barbara presented the Treasurer's Report. The budget was met for 2017. The report was filed for audit.

PARISH FELLOWSHIP: Glenice reported that the Sharing Servant booklets will now cover 3 years. Previously they covered 2 years.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Deb Howe reported that Zion will be delivering Meals-on-Wheels next week. She commented that the Casserole Auction information is on the website. Deb reminded everyone that items for the newsletter are due on Friday, January 19th.

CHURCH PROPERTIES: Tim Numedahl reported that the Christmas trees were taken down. The heat and light issues have been resolved. Tim reported that the "Give Hub" was installed and is ready for use. A presentation will be made to the congregation on how to use it.

WORSHIP BOARD: Sharon Jorde commented that Ash Wednesday is February 14th.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION/YOUTH: Amber Holtan reported that Flapjacks for Faith and the Casserole Auction will be this Sunday, January 21st.

EVANGELISM/LAY MINISTRY: Deb Holtan reported that this year marks the 10th year of the Good Friday Prayer Vigil.

PASTORS' REPORT: Pastor Ale commented that their vacation to Ethiopia from December 25th – January 14th was wonderful. He reported that Lenten Services this year will again be Round Robin. Local pastors and pastors from Oklee, Plummer, and Red Lake Falls will be participating. Ale said confirmation was canceled for 2 weeks due to weather and Connie Hamre's funeral. He reported that Silver Creek will hold its annual meeting next Sunday, January 21st.

Pastor Golv's report was submitted. He noted a couple of changes for Tuesday and Thursday mornings for cardiac rehab. John thanked everyone for their support throughout his health- related issues.

Millie reported that the congregation will be asked to give the gift of their time to fill board positions. Also, her term as president of the congregation and representative on the Synod Council will expire June 30th. Nominations for president will be accepted. Karen Thygeson suggested reviewing and updating the By-Laws before new officers take over.

Millie presented two options of the 2018 Annual Budget. One option included raises for the pastors and the second was without raises. After much discussion, Karen Thygeson made a motion to accept the proposed budget including raises for the pastors with the stipulation that the Personnel Committee meet with each pastor to evaluate their performance and update their duties. The motion was seconded by Glenice and carried.

Millie presented and read a letter and donation from Richard L. Nygard referencing a donation by Zion to his family in 1983. The letter will be presented to the congregation.

After the Lord's Prayer, the meeting adjourned at 7:15 pm.
