Just Another Easter?

Some things are new only once.

The new car is new only for awhile. So is the new house, or the new clothes, or even the new marriage.

Some things, like Easter, are always new, at least potentially.

Repetition can make even the best new thing old and only too familiar. How many times have you said the Lord's Prayer? We know it by heart. We know it so well in fact that we can say it perfectly and think of something else at the same time. That is the danger of repeating something even as important as the Lord's Prayer.

"He is Risen indeed." We say this every year. Does it still have its meaning? Or can we say it perfectly and think about something else at the same time?

None of us can see all of Easter for what it really is. We have some idea of its importance. We can never fully discern how important it is. Easter means one thing when you are eight years old, and quite another when you are a teenager. As the years go by Easter can take on more meaning than we ever would have guessed when we were eight years old.

What does Easter mean to you, this year? Some years resurrection will be the most important thing. More than one elderly person has told me: "It had better be true." Easters come and go but at an advanced age the end of death and the promise of resurrection may well come home to us as never before.

Some years forgiveness will be the most important thing. In church the sermon might lift up Easter as the end of deadly sin and deserved judgment, and then one particular, tenacious, aggravating, overwhelming sin comes immediately to your mind, along with relief and surprise. The relief is genuine. The sin cannot kill. So is the surprise. Well-deserved judgment is never going to happen.

Then the new part of Easter is this: "I can be forgiven, even of my sin."

Some years nothing is more clear than our need for salvation. Some years nothing is more clear to us than God's promises reaching out to us past the day of death. Some years Jesus' suffering, or unconditional love, comes home to us as never before. Some years it will be the humanness of it, or the divinity of it. Easter always has potential beyond what it ever was before.

One part of Easter is new every year: We are always in God's hands, whether we live or die.

Easter is new for me this year because the "for me" part is so overwhelming. What happened in Jerusalem was the salvation of the world, the end of sin and death, the salvation of God. It was for all believers, and in addition to that; it all happened for me. But, astonishingly enough, it was all for me.

What does Easter mean to you, this year? If you are willing to do this, write it down and share it. Whether or not you share it with anyone, write it down to see that there is more to Easter this year than can be written down.

The spiritual experience of Easter is nothing less than God active in your life.

Zion Lutheran Parish Planning Council Minutes March 20, 2018

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Millie Reierson at 5:30 pm. In attendance: President Millie Reierson, Pastor Golv, Pastor Ale Tulu, Deb Howe, Karen Thygeson, Ken Kalsnes, Deb Holtan, Amber Holtan, Sharon Jorde, Sharon Russell and Pam Cwikla.

Millie gave devotions.

The minutes from the February 20, 2018 Council meeting were presented for approval. It was noted that Kami Spears name was not spelled correctly. A motion was made by Ken Kalsnes to accept the minutes with the spelling correction made. The motion was seconded by Sharon Jorde. The motion carried.

Barbara was absent, so Millie presented the Treasurer's Report. The report was filed for audit.

The Give Hub is not being used. Millie said a presentation will be made to the congregation. Information on Simply Giving will be included in the presentation.

Thrivent "Designated Giving" ends March 31. Millie will present a temple talk on Sunday.

Karen Thygeson asked of the Slate of Nominations has been prepared. It has not. Karen stressed the urgency to have the list ready for approval. PUBLIC RELATIONS: Deb Howe reported the Holy Week ad was submitted to the Times. Deb reported that the PR Board needs a chairperson. Karen confirmed that boards should consist of 6-9 members. The newsletter deadline is today.

Evangelism/Lay Ministry: Deb Holtan gave the Council the list of the youth going to the National Gathering and asked them to pray for these. A list of prayer suggestions was included. Deb reported that they are still working on prayer shawls and squares. She reminded everyone of the Prayer Vigil on Good Friday.

Worship: Board minutes from March 6th submitted. Sharon Jorde reported that Lenten services are going well. Holy Week will be busy with Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. There will be communion served at all 3 services.

Silver Creek: Sharon Russell commented that she has enjoyed the Lenten services with the presentation of "Women of the Bible". She reported that they will also serve communion on Easter Sunday. They will be cleaning the church on April 12th. Sharon asked that a date be set for the June joint service.

Parish Fellowship: Minutes from March 6th meeting submitted.

Church Properties: Minutes from March 6th meeting submitted.

Pastors' Reports: Pastor Ale reported that he has a signed agreement between Zion and Silver Creek and he will give it to Linda. Ale said there are 2 people from Silver Creek who will attend the Synod gathering. Ale commented that Thrivent gave a very good presentation on stewardship at the Ministerium meeting. He recommended that we ask them to present at Zion.

April 22 – Mission Sunday - "Water to Thrive". The cost per well is \$5000.

June 24 – Zion Semi-Annual Meeting

Pastor Golv's report was submitted. He presented information from "VANCO – Churchgoer Giving Study", listing 5 key findings:

Churchgoers' preference for e-Giving continues to grow. The overall preference for e-Giving showed a slight increase from 2015, but remains strong across all age groups, and it is much stronger among older adults than it was in 2015.

Those who prefer e-Giving are more engaged than those who prefer traditional giving and contribute a higher percentage of their salaries to their church. e-Givers contribute a larger percentage of their salary (6.9%) to the church compared to traditional givers (5.9%). They are also more engaged in church activities than traditional givers.

Across all age groups, frequency of church attendance and use of traditional giving methods declined. Churchgoers attending services once a week or more, fell 20% over the past two years. Fewer people are using traditional giving methods like cash and checks in the offering plate or mailing in their contributions to the church.

Weekly giving has declined, and more people are giving less often.

15% fewer churchgoers give weekly; 34% down from 49% in 2015

3% more give once a month; 23% up from 20% in 2015

6% more give every 2-3 months; 12% up from 6% in 2015

6% more give every 6 months, 8% up from 2% in 2015

Millennials express a strong preference for e-Giving, contribute more of their annual income to the church and are more engaged in church activities outside of worship services than any other age group. Three of four (75%) millennials – age 25to 34 – expressed preferences for e-Giving ad 36% give 10% of their income to the church. They're also more likely to participate in some church activities than any other age group.

After the Lord's Prayer, the meeting adjourned at 6:30 pm.

Mission Sunday - April 22

Zion will welcome a very special speaker, Rev. Dan Kolander, as our guest pastor at this year's Mission Sunday, April 22. Rev. Kolander works with Rev. Phil Blom on "Water to Thrive" which has provided more than 750 wells in Ethiopia, Tanzania, Sierra Leone, and Uganda. Last summer, Pastor Ale was one of the volunteers helping at the US Open PGA Golf Tournament in Wisconsin, where the PGA donated generously to Water to Thrive.

In many rural African countries, the source of water for drinking, cooking, or bathing either comes from a contaminated local river or traveling long distances to a safe water source, carrying the water home. Diseases from unsafe river water kill more people every year than all forms of violence, including war. Those seeking the safe, spring-fed water sources are often women and girls, walking 1-3 hours, sometimes multiple times a day. This means no time to attend school or to help earn the family's living

The average new well costs \$5,000 and provides at least 500 people with clean, safe water for 20 years. Clean water reduces poverty, improves health, increases access to education, and saves lives. Our goal at Zion it to start a well-building campaign, ultimately funding a well for one village. For more information, check out their website: www.watertothrive.org


