# From the Senior Pastor Churches Together

At the Parish Planning Council's last meeting of 2018, the vote to advance the following proposal was adopted.

# **Churches Together**

**Youth Ministry Proposal** 

### **Summary:**

In the era of diminishing church size, congregations are challenged with balancing growth of congregation participation and thus supporting the mission with having securely funded mission activities to support the spiritual growth of its congregation. The investment of precious resources calls for creative partnerships that recognizes each church's autonomy and celebrates their combined unity.

#### **Statement of Need:**

Zion Lutheran Church (ZLC) and Redeemer Lutheran Church (RLC) have both experienced a drop in the congregation attendance and a drift of young family spiritual participation.

Decreased participation is directly related to the congregation's ability to support varied ministries in general and youth ministry specifically.

# **Project Description:**

- 1. ZLC and RLC have already begun steps toward resource collaboration and management to support the congregation's spiritual growth. Partnering to provide Vacation Bible School with Pathways has been a positive interaction for the youth. We found out that the venture was relatively painless.
- 2. We feel it is time to grow the collaboration further with the pursuit of a joint Youth and Family Ministry.
- 3. The process would include the approval of the two church congregations to develop a joint committee to define needs, roles and resources; begin a search for a candidate; with the qualified candidate innovatively design and implement the ZLC and RLC Youth Ministry.

# **Budget Analysis:**

Salary Range: \$44,000 to \$50,000

Benefits: \$10,000 to \$15,000 (Insurance, retirement match, etc.)

Mileage Reimbursement: \$250Continuing Education: \$250

Payroll tax match: \$3,400 to \$3,800
Total Annual Cost: \$57.900 to \$69,300

**Conclusion:** ZLC and RLC have history in successful collaboration to bring ministry opportunities to their joint congregations to enhance spiritual growth. They come to the table now with the willingness to pursue this next level of partnership. A question comes up "What if the Youth and Family Ministry grows so that the volumes of families drawn to prayerful participation in our church ministries makes it difficult for one Youth Minister to manage?"

That's a problem we would joyfully embrace.

# **How Did This Happen?**

Both Zion Lutheran and Redeemer Lutheran care deeply about the spiritual health of young people and their families

This proposal is the result of two meetings. The first was held with the president of RLC, their pastor and with Zion's president, Pastor Ale, and I. The first meeting was called to see if there would be interest in doing mutual ministry with our young people by sharing a staff person.

The group decided that there was interest in moving ahead.

At every stage, Trinity Lutheran has been invited. At present they do not wish to participate. They are and will continue to be fully informed. If at some point they do wish to participate, that can certainly be negotiated, and they are welcome.

The second meeting included the treasurers from each congregation. The focus was to design a remuneration package substantial enough to attract qualified candidates. The salary range is as large as it is to accommodate varying education and experience levels.

#### **Rationale**

A staff person dedicated to ministry with youth and families has long been part of the ministry at Zion. Both congregations have a long and rich heritage of youth ministry.

Especially at Zion, building on the success of our large and growing Sunday School is a mission opportunity.

#### How would we share?

Much of what has been done previously will continue. Some aspects of shared youth ministry will be new. Considerable freedom to develop an appropriate new program of youth ministry will be given to the new person.

# **Supervision**

Pastor Cory and I will do week to week supervision. A combined Youth Board will be formed to offer ideas, help, and encouragement.

Bishop Wohlrabe is fully informed. He supports this effort and volunteered to give us a list of qualified people who may we wish to interview.

At the December Council meeting, the positive vote meant that two budgets will be proposed at the annual meeting on January 27. One budget will contain line items for the youth director, which will be shared equally with Redeemer. The second budget will not.

The Parish Planning Council wants the proposal to be thoroughly discussed and understood before the annual meeting.

Zion Lutheran Parish Planning Council Minutes December 18, 2018

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 5:30 p.m. In attendance were President Laura Rude, Pastor John Golv, Pastor Ale Tulu, Tim Numedahl, Karen Thygeson, Penni Nelson, Jodi Bergman, Glenice Johnson, Sharon Jorde, Mike Spears and Deb Holtan.

Guest in attendance was Amber Holtan representing the Youth and Christian Ed board.

The minutes for November 20, 2018 were presented and approved. A motion was made to accept the minutes, the motion carried.

The Treasurer's Report was filed for audit.

**Stewardship Board:** President Laura Rude shared with the council notes about information from Consecration Sunday provide by Dennis Yost. There were 80 households to date that have turned in pledge cards with a commitment of \$169,833.00 which is up from 2017.

Worship Board: Sharon Jorde reported there is a concern that it is hard to get ushers because of one of the ushering duties is to bring the mornings offering to the bank. Is there a way to simplify this? The hope of the New Traditions group was to get the murals up before Christmas in the River Brew area, but the person that is to do this has been ill. Sharon reported that Jamie Bakken from the New Traditions group is looking into using a small band occasionally during the New Traditions Service. The council decided to table any actions until more information and details are obtained.

**Properties Board:** Mike Spears reported they did not meet, but the coffee maker in the kitchen has been fixed and locked. The trees were put up and the water heater for the kitchenette is still in the works. They are waiting on the electrical work that is needed, hoping it will be completed around the first of the new year. Also the elevator has been fixed.

**Evangelism and Lay Ministry:** President Laura Rude read from an email provided by Marijo Nabben that the board did not meet, but the board will continue to work on areas that were focused on in November.

Christian Ed and Youth: Amber reported that board member Sarah Villaneauva is considering taking the chair position. Kami Spears is working on putting together a Lock In with the senior youth group. An upcoming event is "Zion Youth, Family and Friends Nativity Bingo." The next Flapjacks for Faith will be January 20th. A reminder that the Flapjacks For Faith has been opened up to anyone in the congregation. The money raised can go towards a youth's individual account or a church organization or function that is within the church, for example: the music fund March is just around the corner so the board will be gearing up for Bible Camp information and sign up.

**Parish Fellowship:** Glenice Johnson reported there is an update from the Pie Auction on the total amount raised with a late donation making it \$4,580.00! The new Sharing Servants and ZLCW Women's booklets are out and available in the Upper Narthex. Glenice wanted to again emphasize that December's Sharing Servants does not have leaders. There were 18 people that went caroling to Oakland Park, Valley Home, Greenleaf and to the Care Center on December 9<sup>th</sup>. The ZLCW did approve the draft on their group's representation. They had their Christmas Tea on December 11th. The leftover cookies and apple cider from the event were donated for use the night of the Holiday Train. The ZLCW is looking at long-range plans because of the declining numbers in circle members. A donation of \$7,000.00 from the ZLCW was made towards Zion's budget. President Laura Rude asked Glenice to extend a big thank you from the Council to the women for their generous donation.

**Public Relations:** Jodi Bergman reported they did not meet. She has been working on trying to get the church's website back on track. It did an automatic update and some things are not accessible. It was suggested that the board get some feed back from the newest members of Zion for their opinions about the website. Also suggested; forming a small committee to look at the website updates. January 14-18 is Zion's time for delivering Meals on Wheels.

**Silver Creek:** Penni Nelson wanted to give a reminder that their Christmas Eve service is at 5:30 with communion. They will not have a Sunday service on the 23<sup>rd</sup> and their annual meeting will be January 20th.

President Laura Rude again emphasized the need to work on Zion's vision! We need to make Zion friendly and inviting, not just during our services, but also during the fellowship time between services or at any other time.

Pastor John submitted his report. He stated that Sheila Nelson will be our accompanist the next two Sundays. Churches Together: Zion and Redeemer are working on details for a Youth Ministry putting together a proposal. The council approved going ahead with this proposal and to present it to the congregation at the annual meeting.

Pastor Ale reminded everyone of March 24th which is our Mission Sunday and that Paul Oman will be our guest speaker at both services and he will be using canvas art with his presentation. Pastor Ale also stated that Jonathan Swenson will be here on Wednesday February 6<sup>th</sup> as a guest speaker for the area confirmation students at 7:00. Zion will be hosting this event. There will be more information to follow.

The meeting was adjourned after saying the Lord's Prayer. The next meeting will be Tuesday January 15th at 5:30 p.m.
