As we are now in the same month that a year ago, our lives became greatly impacted by the Covid-19 Pandemic. In a year that's been like no other, it has had me reflecting on growth and change. This pandemic has created opportunities to be creative, flexible, extend grace, and try new things out (which some worked out and some didn't), yet we learned much!

There seems to be a glimmer of hope that we may be finding our new normal sooner, rather than later. That glimmer of hope I feel now is feeling like those early morning captains' practices for sport seasons I remember from the athletic days in high school. Moving and pushing the comfort levels of the muscles in a body takes a lot of consistency, determination, teamwork, and learning. It is not always fun or easy, and let me tell ya, it doesn't always look so graceful- but it's a work in progress!

At the beginning of a new sports season, there's new training methods and a lot of sore muscles from being worked in new ways. So it's been a year since the season of the Pandemic came upon us. Hebrews 12:1-2 tells us to lay our weights down at the foot of the cross and run with endurance looking to Jesus...who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Traditionally a race means that the quickest time to complete a distance is typically the desired outcome, I think God created us to work *all* of our muscles and (crazy enough) *enjoy* the race and slow down!

We need to understand the pains of learning through failing or missing the mark, help us grow stronger and run the race with grace. Please keep our youth and families in your prayers as they too are learning new ways to reach goals and build endurance in Christ.

Zion Lutheran's Parish Planning Council Minutes Via Zoom February 16, 2021

The Parish Planning Council meeting was called to order by President Laura Rude at 7:02 p.m. In attendance were Laura Rude, Pastor Ale Tulu, Tim Numedahl, Madison Crane, Barbara Overbye, Sharon Jorde, Darlene Hulteen, Mike Spears, Glenice Johnson, Penni Nelson and Deb Holtan.

Pastor Ale led the council in prayer.





The Secretary's report was presented. A motion was made to accept the minutes as printed. The motion was seconded and approved.

Barbara Overbye reminded the council that the church is working under a proposed budget. Barbara brought up the PPP (Payroll Protection Plan) suggesting that the council be proactive in asking what the next step with this program is. Laura said she would contact the person at Northern State Bank that is helping with this program. The loan from savings has been paid back.

The Treasurers Report was filed for audit.

Pastor Ale reported that on Thursday February 11th, the Annual Conference Meeting was held via Zoom with Bishop Tesch attending the meeting. The mission statement is "Wholly Devoted". The Bishop asked those in attendance to thank their congregations for their support with the Synod's budget. Synod Assembly takes place virtually on May 22, 2021. The meeting will take place from 9:30-4:30. The Church Wide Assembly is in Columbus, Ohio this August. The two elected people from our area are Pastor Linda from Oklee and our own Madison Crane. There will be no Round Robin this year. Pastor Mark Helgeland has written a sermon series entitled "Golf and the Spirit". He will preach his series over the five weeks of lent. A motion was made to pay Pastor Helgeland \$500.00 for assisting with the Lenten services. The motion was seconded and carried.

Madison Crane reported that the Program Executive Director from Pathways and the director from Luther Crest met via zoom. They gave an update on what their summer schedule is looking like. Camp Sunday is February 28th here at Zion. Confirmation classes will not meet during lent, but confirmands are required to participate either in person or virtually during the Lenten services. Madison reported she attended the Extravaganza Event held a couple of weeks ago. In doing so she was able to get a discounted membership which will give her access to tons of resources in pdf form. 1st Communion Classes will take place in person March 21st and 28th. There will be no Seder Meal. The Youth and Family of Churches Together meeting for this coming Saturday has been postponed allowing a time when Trinity can be included. Pathways annual meeting will be March 21st from 3-4:30 pm.

Penni Nelson reported that they had to cancel their last two Sunday worship services due to the cold weather. They had a New Member Sunday!


Glenice Johnson gave an update on the progress concerning the updates on the constitution.
